THE COLLEGE

Golaghat Purbanchalik College was established in 1987 at Hatiyekhowa, a rural place of Golaghat District. A few social workers actively pursued the idea of establishing a College at the centre of this area to serve the purpose of higher education since the year 1974. The first public meeting was arranged at Molia Gaon L P School comprising a group of people from Dhekial Mauza, Gurjogonia Mauza, Kakodonga Mauza and Dakhingera Mauza on 21st December, 1974. Let Tulsi Nath Borgohain then the Headmaster of Dhekial High School was the president of that public meeting. After a few meetings held consecutively in different places of the locality on this occasion, the decision was taken and proposed the name of the college as 'Golaghat Purbanchalik College'. The ideal location was selected in the grazing land of Gurjogonia Mauza near Hatiyekhowa Chariali (crossroads) with a view to spread higher education of humanities among the masses. The foundation stone was laid on 15th September 1987, and the Governing Body was formed for administering the college. Many people took part in the inaugural ceremony on that day. B.A. classes were started in the same year.

Since then, the college has been marching along with time and able to meet the aspirations over the years of the people of the locality, the district as well as the state of Assam. It has been playing a key role in socio-economic development of the society. Now, it becomes a foremost institution of the state providing an excellent opportunity to interact among students coming from different places irrespective of ethnic groups and linguistic background. To prepare for the students to cope up with the challenges of modern society and to inculcate them with the spirit of leadership in different avenues have all along been the guiding principles of the college. Over the years, the college has been maintaining a fairly good record of performance in University Examinations. The products of the college are now holding many responsible positions of the society.

Presently the college comprises 7 departments of Arts disciplines. The college has well-equipped library with wireless internet connectivity and e-journal browsing facility. In addition, each department has its own library from which books are regularly issued to the students. The other special features of the college are- a gymnasium with various facilities and a canteen. Moreover, an education laboratory is available for practical classes. The college offers regular U.G. courses under Dibrugarh University in the departments of Assamese, Education, Economics, English, Political Science, Sociology and History. Bearing in mind, the necessity of a healthy environment, the college was declared a tobacco-free zone. Yoga camps are organized by the NSS wing in the college. Golaghat Purbanchalik College has been constantly executing in-house plans to enhance the scope of its educational initiatives. The college has grown in course of time in the last 38 years and nurtures a dream of becoming a Centre of Excellence.

THE CAMPUS

Situated at the Hatyekhwa Gaon the Golaghat Purbanchalik College campus is extremely suitable, safe and congenial for students. It is located in an area surrounded by tea gardens and local communities who are closely related with the institution. It is surrounded by boundary walls by three sides and gate at all entrance. While entering the college premises it is mandatory for the students to wear college uniform and to carry valid identity cards issued by the college. Visitors are required to register their names and purpose of visit at the college gates to avoid entry of any unscrupulous individual to the campus. The College Administration has installed many close circuit cameras to keep a constant vigilance on the campus and to ensure security of the students. The infrastructural set up of the college is as given below:

Administrative Building

Library

This building contains a well-equipped Central Library with wireless internet connectivity and e-journal browsing facility. In addition, each department has its own library from which books are regularly issued to the students.

LIBRARY

Golghat Purbanchalik College library was established in 1987- the establishment year of the college. In the time of beginning it had a few books. Gradually, the collection of books as well as the services have been improved. Ex-Students, faculty members, office staff of the college past and present and well wishers have been donated lots of books to the library. Students, faculty members and the staff have membership of the college library. The objectives of the college library are to ensure easy and timely access to its resources. In order to meet the challenges of the time and cope up with readers, new management procedures and information and communication technologies (ICT) have been deployed. To promote reading habits among the users the library committee has introduced the ‘Best Library User Prize’. The Library has over 2120 (Two thousand one hundred and twenty) books, some recent and back volumes of Magazines, Journals and daily News Papers. The library installed ‘KOHA’ an Integrated Library Management Software (ILMS) in June 2023 to handle management functions and provides services to patrons. Considering the fact that majority of the users belong to economically weaker families the library takes extra care to them. The library also organize orientation programme and takes feedback from its users regularly.

LIBRARY MEMBERSHIP

Library membership is compulsory for all students and library membership form will have to be submitted to the librarian/Asstt. Librarian after admission.

Library Rules and Regulations

- 1) Library working hour starts from 9.00a.m. to 4.00 p.m.
- 2) It is mandatory to keep silence in the Library
- 3) Entry of students without uniform is not allowed
- 4) Everybody is required to sign at the time of entry to the Library
- 5) Students, teachers and the staff are mandatory to make the Library Membership Card for borrowing books and other library materials.
- 6) All personal belongings except purse and note book, will not be allowed to take inside the library.
- 7) Books are to be issued to the members only for 10 days, exceeding which they will have to pay Rs.1.00 per day.
- 8) Students will have to pay full price of a book lost, to not be faced any way by them.

Important Note: Library Rules and Regulations are displayed inside the library. Students/members of the library will have to strictly follow all the rules and regulations laid down by the Assistant Librarian. The College Assistant Librarian reserves the right to suspend the membership of any student/member found violating library rules.

Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC)

Golaghat Purbanchalik College has an active Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) as per the guidelines of The National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC). The IQAC plans, guides and monitors Quality Assurance (QA) and Quality Enhancement (QE) activities of the college. The main task of the IQAC is to channelize the efforts and measures of the college towards maintaining academic excellence and robust internal governance. IQAC initiates and supervises various activities which are necessary to increase the quality of education. IQAC promotes several activities such as seminars, workshops, symposia, conferences, panel discussions and academic meetings.

Right to Information Cell/Committee

In compliance with the RTI Act 2005, the College has constituted the RTI Cell of which the Principal is the First Appellate Authority. The aim of RTI is to promote transparency and accountability in official matters.

Students' Grievances Redressal Cell/Committee

As suggested by University Grants Commission, New Delhi, the College has established a Students' Grievance Redressal Cell, to provide a mechanism for redressal of students' grievances and ensure the transparency in admission, and prevention of unfair practices, etc. The function of the cell is to look into the complaints lodged by any student, and judge its merit. The cell is also empowered to look into matters of harassment. Anyone with a genuine grievance may approach the cell. In case the person is unwilling to appear in self, grievances may be sent through e-mail to the Principal or to the co-ordinator of the cell.

Anti-Ragging Committee

As per judgments and directions of the Supreme Court of India, UGC guidelines and State Government's Instructions, Golaghat Purbanchalik College is following 'Zero-Tolerance Policy' towards ragging. To prevent any kind of such incident, the College has constituted an Anti-Ragging Committee which is continuously monitoring the students. Any student of Golaghat Purbanchalik College accused of and found guilty of ragging, will be severely dealt with, in accordance with the Provisions of the Law. GENERAL ADMISSION RULES

Eligibility

- 4 Year Degree Programme (FYUGP): A student who has passed 12th standard or equivalent examination in any stream from a recognized institution.

Admission Procedure: The office of the Principal shall issue notification inviting application for admission into the Four Year Under Graduate Programme (FYUGP) and other programmes through the College website.

Online Submission of Application Form

- Admission into FYUGP (Arts) 1st sem will be conducted via the common Admission Portal available in SAMARTH platform as per Government Notification.
- Candidates seeking admission in Golaghat Purbanchalik College will have to fill up an online admission form available in the College website: www.purbanchalikcollege.edu.in Kindly visit the college website. (Hard copy of application will not be available in the college office).

NECESSARY DOCUMENTS MUST BE UPLOADED ONLINE WHILE SUBMITTING THE FORM. THE COLLEGE WILL NOT ENTERTAIN ANY INCOMPLETE APPLICATION OR APPLICATION SUBMITTED AFTER THE LAST DATE OF SUBMISSION.

- Applications with relevant documents will be accepted.
- Admission will be held purely on merit basis:

Admission to the FYUGP will be based on the basis of the marks obtained in Subjects of the H.S. examination and on the approval of the Selection Committee and the Principal.

There is reservation of seats for S.C. & S.T. students as per Government Rules. A few seats may be allotted to the students having outstanding performance in the field of Sports and Culture.

- There is a provision for reservation of seats for differently abled persons as per government rules.
- Candidates who have passed the qualifying examinations earlier than the current year must submit a gap certificate regarding his/her activities during that period from proper authority.
- Candidates seeking admission must produce originals of all the submitted documents at a later time which will be duly notified as and when required.
- Candidates seeking admission to the College will be interviewed on the specified dates as per Notification.

ADMISSION FEES STRUCTURE

Golaghat Purbvanchalik College is a Provincialized College of Assam established in the year 1987 is presently offering B.A. (Hons.) courses in Assamese, Economics, Education, Political Science, History and Sociology as per curriculum of affiliation university (DibrugarhUniversity). Hence, admission will be offered to the students for the four years B.A. (FYUGP) and the fee structure will be decided accordingly as per rules of the Government of Assam.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION TO THE STUDENTS

IDENTITY CARD AND ACADEMIC CALENDAR

- An identity card will be issued to every student after admission to the College. The card shall contain information of the holder along with a recent passport size photograph of the student duly endorsed by the Principal.
- The Identity Card is non-transferable. A student must keep the Identity Card withhim/her and he/she must produce the same whenever asked for.
- Students must renew his/her Identity Card at the end of each academic year positively
- Every student will be issued the Academic Calendar and the same has to be properly maintained by him/her. The records available in the Academic Calendar will be used for various official purposes concerning the student.

EXAMINATION

The College Examinations are held according to the College Academic Calendar for Degree classes. A student must appear in all the examinations conducted by the College during an academic year. The College follows the rules and regulations of Dibrugarh University in the Under Graduate (UG) Programme.

- As such, a student's performance is strictly monitored through continuous basis, through assessment in the theory and practical courses. Internal assessment is based on Sessional Examinations, class tests, home assignments, seminars, projects, group discussions, field trips, class attendance etc. At the end of each semester a final external examination is conducted as per the schedule fixed by the University.
- There shall be 40% marks for in-semester assessment and 60% marks for End-semester examination in each course during every semester.
- There shall be no provision for re-evaluation of the answer-scripts of the end-semester examinations. However, a candidate may apply for re-scrutiny.
- End Semester Examination :
There shall be one End semester examination carrying 60% Marks in each course of a semester covering the entire syllabus prescribed for the course. The end semester examination is normally a written/laboratory based examination /project-work/Dissertation.

ATTENDANCE

All the Students must attend classes regularly. The minimum attendance should be 80% of the classes held in each subject in an academic year. Students whose attendance falls below 80% but above 60% will be considered as non collegiate. Students with attendance below 60% will be debarred from appearing in the End-Semester Examination and treated as dis-collegiate. A student declared as dis-collegiate shall not be allowed to proceed to the next higher Semester. He/she shall need to pursue the Semester afresh in which he/she was declared as dis-collegiate along with the next fresh batch.

MAINTENANCE OF COLLEGE DISCIPLINE:

All the students are required to maintain strict discipline in and around the college. Students who disobey college rules and regulations are liable to disciplinary actions like issue of compulsory transfer certificate and even expulsion from the college. Any of the following acts by a student shall be considered as an offence :-

- Ragging is strictly prohibited in the college. Students found indulging in such activities will be immediately expelled from the college and legal action will be taken in accordance with the Hon'ble Supreme Court verdict.
- Violation of college uniform.

- Various forms of immoral and indecent acts.
- Resorting to violence of any kind.
- Disobedience to college authority and teachers.
- Damaging, defacing or devaluing any College property.

CODE OF CONDUCT FOR STUDENTS

DISCIPLINE

The Principal invites the co-operation of the students and their guardians in the creation and the maintenance of an atmosphere conducive to academic and cultural development, and in upholding the traditions of the college. Students are especially invited to cooperate, in their own interest with their elected Student Union Body and Class Representative to ensure enforcement of rules regarding discipline.

Does and Doesn't

1. Students must be punctual and regular in attending classes, class tests examinations etc. Failure to obtain the required attendance percentage, non-submission of assignments and unjustified absence from tests /examinations will be treated as breaching the code of conduct.
2. Student must be seated in their classrooms at the beginning of each period. They must not enter or leave the class room without permission of the lecturer.
3. Impersonation during roll call is a punishable offence.
4. Use of Mobile Phone during class hours is prohibited and is liable for punishment.
5. Resorting to any kind of malpractice (copying, impersonation, use of unfair means, exchanging answer-sheets) during examinations will not be tolerated and will be dealt with severely.
6. Students should carefully follow the Notices put up on the Notice Board (both online and offline). No excuse will be considered if Notices on the Board are ignored.
7. When a professor is absent or is unable to take class, students should maintain a strict order among themselves so as to not disturb the adjoining classes. Under no circumstances should they leave the classroom without ascertaining the relieve orders from the Principal/Staff room.
8. Students are expected to treat the members of the staff both teaching and non teaching and their fellow students with courtesy both in and outside the College. Students shall not, by their act or conduct, cause damage to the reputation of the institution.
9. Students are expected to come to College Uniform suitably maintaining decency.

10. Students must wear and display visibly their Identity Cards while entering the College and always keep it on your person during College hours inside the campus.
11. Students are not allowed to loiter or stand about the verandas or corridors of the College during class hours.
12. When assembled every class must consider itself responsible for the conduct of its members.
13. Students are forbidden from inviting friends from other institutions and outsiders to the College.
14. No posters are to be pasted or fixed with cell tape anywhere on the College walls. Any writing, scribbling on the walls will attract disciplinary measures against the student.
15. Smoking, chewing and spitting tobacco products or pan masala, consumption of alcohol or narcotic drugs is strictly prohibited inside the college premises. Violation of this rule will invite disciplinary action. The college premises is a smoking free zone, respect it.
16. Students must refrain from mishandling and tampering with library books or college computer systems.
17. As tudent shall not commit or cause breach of peace inside and around the College campus.
18. Students are prohibited from indulging in games, even in small groups, anywhere in the College premises during lecture hours.
19. Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited. Disciplinary action will be taken against those who violate this rule. It is mandatory for all students and guardians to sign an affidavit in thepro forma prescribed by the University of Calcutta related to ragging.

ANTI-RAGGING POLICY

In conformity with Supreme Court of India judgements and directions, UGC guidelines and State Government Instructions, Golaghat Purbanchalik College is following 'Zero-Tolerance Policy' towards ragging. Any student of Golaghat Purbanchalik College accused and found guilty of ragging, will be severely dealt with, in accordance with the Provisions of the Law.

Anti-Ragging Policy

According to the UGC Regulation on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Institutions, 2009, ragging constitutes one or more of any of the following acts:

- Any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student.
- Indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension there of in any fresher or any other student.
- Asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student.
- Any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher.
- Exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students.
- Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students.
- Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person;
- Any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, post, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student.
- Any act of physical or mental abuse (including bullying and exclusion) targeted at another student (fresher or otherwise) on the ground of colour, race, religion, caste, ethnicity, gender (including transgender), sexual orientation, appearance, nationality, regional origins, linguistic identity, place of birth, place of residence or economic background.

Punishments

According to the UGC Regulation on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009, depending on the nature and gravity of the guilt established by the Anti-Ragging

Squad, those found guilty may be awarded one or more of the following punishments, namely;

- Warning , writing apology letter
- Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
- Withholding/withdrawing scholarship/fellowship and other benefits.
- Debarring from appearing in any test/examination or other evaluation process.
- Withholding results.
- Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
- Suspension/expulsion from the hostel.
- Cancellation of admission.
- Rustication from the institution for period ranging from one to four semesters.
- Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period.

Powers and Functions: Anti Ragging

- To uphold and comply with the directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court and be vigilant on any acts amounting to ragging;
- To publicize to all students and prevalent directives and the action that can be taken against those indulging in ragging;
- To consider the complaints received from the students and conduct an enquiry and submit report to the Anti- Ragging Committee along with punishment recommended for the offenders;
- Oversee the procedure of obtaining undertaking from the students in accordance with the provisions;
 - Conduct workshops against ragging menace and orient the students;
 - To provide students the information pertaining to contact address and telephone numbers of the person(s) identified to receive complaints/distress calls;
 - To offer services of counseling and create awareness to the students;
 - To take all necessary measures for prevention of Ragging inside the Campus.
